

#11 - The Carrying Place

The Carrying Place was a trail and portage used for hundreds of years by the First Nations traveling between Presqu'ile Bay and the Bay of Quinte. It was later developed as a route to York (Toronto). The village of Carrying Place now sits at the eastern end of the Murray Canal, which connected the two bays by water in the 1890s.

#12 - Burial Sites

In Picton, there are at least two burial sites connected to Indigenous peoples. One site, which contained at least 12 burials, was dated to the Late Archaic period, and contained grave objects made of marine shell, copper, and bone. The other is the museum/church cemetery – the final resting place for at least five Mohawk children who died in the late 19th century.
